

## carlos bunga fragments for a cartography of return

Nara Roesler presents *Fragments for a Cartography of Return*, a solo exhibition by Carlos Bunga (Porto, 1976), an artist known for his subtle, poetic, radical investigation into the metamorphic materiality of art as shelter, model, performative mapping, prototype. Bunga's admirable mastery of all mediums serves as an effective means to address a nomadic practice characterized by his fascination for potential forms. The subtle ambiguity of his architectural sculptures (models) and his paintings on cardboard and tapestries places most of his works on the critical interval between that which has been and that which could be: past and future, ruin and prototype, absence and utopia.

This poetic uncertainty informs Bunga's art as a nomadic practice. Contrary to the sedentary, as Deleuze and Guattari had stated long ago, the nomad does not go from one point to another. It is the trajectory, not the origin nor the destination, that matters for the nomadic. In that sense Carlos Bunga does not stop mapping, marking ways of passage, emphasizing the porosity of art. Maps to nowhere, from nowhere. Atopic cartography.

For this exhibition at Nara Roesler, Bunga will set a project in three phases or 'stations': he will intervene in the large window of the gallery with an installation combining paintings, found objects, and sculptures composing an "assemblage" of traces, opened towards the outer space. A first gallery, upon entering the exhibition space, will be focused on his signature 'maps': sensuous, richly textured paintings on cardboard and fabrics. As useless cartographies, these works open the space towards an experience of disorienting passages and expectation. "The nomad -has written Deleuze and Guattari- knows how to wait, his patience is infinite." Finally Bunga will occupy the largest room of the gallery with a monumental painting covering the entire floor of the exhibition space with light hanging sculptures and found objects. The beholders are invited to walk through this floor painting and to wander around the suspended sculptures that Bunga calls *Casulos* (*Cocoons*), larvae-shaped bodies, sculptures yet to become, as if the entire experience was a way to return towards the potential, to the imminence of forms.



## carlos bunga

b. 1976, Porto, Portugal lives and works in Barcelona, Spain

Carlos Bunga creates process-oriented works in various formats: sculptures, paintings, drawings, performances, video, and above all in situ installations, that refer to and intervene in their immediate architectural surroundings.

While often using ordinary, unassuming materials such as packing cardboard and adhesive tape, Bunga's work involves a highly developed degree of aesthetic care and delicacy, as well as a conceptual complexity derived from the inter-relationship between doing and undoing, between unmaking and remaking, between the micro and the macro, between investigation and conclusion. Straddling the divide between sculpture and painting, Bunga's deceptively delicate works are characterized by an intense study of the combination of color and materiality, while at the same time emphasize the performative aspect of the creative act.

Bunga's works on paper, which are closely related to his sculptures and installations, often involve overlays, whether of compositional elements in the paintings or sheets of translucent paper in the drawings. The analytic/descriptive result, like a photographic double-exposure, mimics the dual experience of memory and imagination underlying the sculpture.
